Starting a Public Montessori School A Planning Timeline

PHASE I: PRE-PLANNING (18 – 24 MONTHS AHEAD OF OPENING)

Gathering Stakeholders & Assembling Resources

- Assemble a design team
- Establish relationships with nearby Montessori schools, public and private
- Learn about local options for starting schools: district, magnet, charter
- Educate local leaders (school leaders, community leaders, parents)
 - Visit nearby public Montessori programs
- Prepare a fact sheet that addresses key questions related to launching a public program:
 - Proposed size of program
 - Potential locations of program
 - Start-up costs
 - Teacher recruitment and training
- If your state offers start-up support (available specifically for new charters), apply for financial or technical assistance
- Cultivate funders to support initial planning (typically `12-18 months ahead of school opening)

PHASE II: INITIAL PLANNING (12 MONTHS AHEAD OF OPENING)

Operationalizing the Vision

- Finalize plans for size, scope and location of program
- Draft and submit application (for charter or magnet)
- Reconstitute initial design team to serve as official planning board, responsible for:
 - Negotiating agreements with state/district
 - Hiring architects, contractors and other professionals necessary to prepare physical plant
 - Recruiting and hiring school leader
 - Developing system of student recruitment and selection
 - Managing budget
- Launch School website
- Recruit students and families

PHASE III: FINAL PLANNING (FIVE MONTHS AHEAD OF OPENING)

Countdown to Opening

- Complete operations plan
- Hire instructional staff
- Conduct lottery
- Orient new families
- Complete all needed construction/renovation
