

 Determining whether or not the tests accomplish what they were designed to accomplish.




How Do We Think About Our Students?

Achievement Gap vs. Education Debt

"... a focus on the gap is misplaced. Instead, we need to look at the "education debt" that has accumulated over time. This debt comprises historical, economic, sociopolitical, and moral components."

-Gloria Ladson-Billings

The term "racial achievement gap" unfairly constructs students as "defective and lacking" and "admonishes them that they need to catch up." Ladson-Billings suggested the term "education debt," moving to a discourse that "holds us all accountable."


